Owl bird feeder.









1/ Using a black felt-tip, draw the front opening onto the front of one of the cartons and draw the wing flaps onto each side of the carton. Recycle the other carton - you won't need this one.
2/ Ask a grown-up to to cut round these markings for you.



3/ Using your colour of choice, paint the carton and leave to dry completely. (If you haven't got acrylic paint, use water-based paint and mix in some pva glue to help it stick to the carton).

4/ Glue the 2 milk bottle tops onto the front of the carton to make the owl's eyes



5/ Use the 2 white milk carton screw tops for the middle of the eyes. Glue them in using plenty of PVA glue- once dry use the black marker pen to draw the pupils of the eyes

6/Cut a slit in the carton below the big front opening and slide in the wooden lollipop stick - then cut a slit in the back of the carton and continue to slide the lollipop stick through it so that the stick forms a platform for the birds to stand on and feed

7/ Remember to pull out the owl's wings so it looks like it is flapping its wings

8/ Thread your piece of ribbon/string through the screw top opening and through a hole in the back of the carton and tie. Hang it up somewhere visible in your garden, fill with bird seed and enjoy watching the birds feeding.
